REI Health Fair & Expo Sunday at Tebala Shrine Center

There will be 50 to 55 vendors for the event, including food samplings from Choices Natural Market. The three title sponsors are The Rock River Times, WNIU-WNIJ Radio in Rockford and DeKalb and Choices Natural Market of Rockford.

Food will be served by the Tebala Shrine Center staff.

The REI Health Fair operates entirely with volunteers who will work the event as well as giving Reiki energy healing demonstrations. Raffle tickets for drawings throughout the day will be given at the door. This event would provide a platform for clinical and complementary medicine currently available in northern Illinois and southern Wisconsin.
